Letter of Introduction

To the Mayor, City Council, City Administration, the Residents of Parowan, and all interested parties:

This annual report encompasses art programs in Parowan during the Fiscal Year (FY) ending June 2024. It will appear that programs that I organized receive more coverage than other programs. That, indeed, may be the case, but there is a reason for it: I knew that I would be making this annual report, but neglected to tell other organizers until later in the fiscal year. Therefore, other organizers may not have accumulated the photographic and statistical information to the extent used in documenting the "Third Thursday" program. <u>Thank you to Jet Smith, Events Director</u>, for responding to queries for information regarding programs sponsored by her office.

Several years ago, there was an attempt to create a Parowan Arts Council. That specific effort never really took root. Yet, Parowan's Events Coordinator, the Theater Board, the Community Choir, and others have continued to promote arts events.

Recently I encouraged the administration and elected officials of Parowan to enhance the city's art presence by offering potential participants regular opportunities to gather and create. As the Director of the Cedar City Library, I had gained some experience in organizing art programs, and I thought that Parowan residents would support expanded art opportunities.

The concept of a regular, city-sponsored, visual art program began to gain some traction. In November 2022, Mayor Mollie Halterman asked me to present a brief explanation of two things at a Town Meeting: the happenings of the new Iron County Public Art Commission, and, for the first time in an open meeting, my vision of a coordinated, city-sponsored series of art events. During the budget meetings of March 2023, I was invited back to offer an expanded report. Again, I posited that the city would benefit from an arts coordinator. A tentative program budget of \$2,500 for visual arts was passed in May and finalized in June. The "Third Thursday" program was born.

As often happens between the planning stages and the implementation of any program, the "Third Thursday" prospectus was not followed with exactness. Changes were necessary for the program to function properly and to meet the expressed desires of this participant-driven project. For example, the prospectus did not anticipate demonstration only events. However, Mary Jabens' demonstration event in May garnered high participant evaluation scores.

This report is an attempt to chronicle arts events in Parowan for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024. Any omissions, deletions, or misrepresentations are unintended.


August 17, Oil & Watercolor Painting with Tiffany Marchant. Third Thursday Program.

The 2023 Cantata was the 79th *consecutive* Cantata, according to Conductor and Musical Director, Heather Shurtleff. "The same beautiful music has been sung since 1944 when PHS music teacher, Newell Waite, chose the music with the help of his [Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints] ward. 



April 21, Community Choir Concert Jay Wilcken, Director Candy Wilson, Accompanist

Whether the weather be fine, Or whether the weather be not, Whether the weather be cold, Or whether the weather be hot, We'll weather the weather Whatever the weather, Whether we like it or not!

The Parowan Community Choir has been in existence in its current form since 1976, when Parowan joined the rest of the nation to celebrate 200 years of American independence. The theme of the 2024 spring concert was "Weather." The event featured seventeen numbers (choral, vocal solo, and piano solo). It was narrated by Steve Decker.

Choral music has always played a significant role in Parowan. From the Beaver Press, January 10, 1980: "October, 1870, The Parowan Choir performed in Conference [of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints] in Great Salt Lake City. At this time General William Tecumseh Sherman, the hero of the Union Army in the Civil War was in the City." A large group had gathered to hear the military band and to hear from Sherman, but he refused to come out of his lodging at the Townsend House. The Parowan Choir arrived and sang a few pieces. Then they sang, "Hard Times

Come Again No More." Sherman appeared. Apparently referring to those who had gathered earlier, he said, "I address myself, not to the rabble, but to this little band of singers, who, I understand, have traveled by team and wagon 250 miles to sing at their Church Conference. So far as it is in my power, I promise them that 'hard times shall come again no more' to this people."









Oil Painting Demonstration with Mary Jabens

Thursday, May 16, 6:00 p.m.

Location: Pullout for disc golf course, Hwy 143, Parowan Canyon

This program is a little different! There have been multiple requests for a demonstration event at which participants watch and learn from an artist rather than paint along with the artist. This event will be largely demonstration. However, attendees are welcome to bring their own supplies and paint along with Mary.

Bring your own chair or be prepared to stand for substantial periods.

Directions: From the intersection of Main and Center Streets, turn east like you were going to Brian Head. Continue for 1.5 miles. The pullout is on the right (west), about 0.7 miles above the cemetery.



May 16, Oil Painting Demonstration by Mary Jabens

A demonstration only event was not in the "Third Thursday" prospectus. However, as comments and suggestions from monthly participant reviews were evaluated, it was



clear that a demonstration would be well received. Fortunately, Mary would rather demonstrate than teach. The result was a beautiful evening in the mouth of Parowan Canyon watching Mary paint.

Artist Statement: "Mary Jabens currently lives in Southern Utah. Her passion for art is fueled by the scenes around her. Mary's goal as an artist is to communicate with the viewer the joy she sees in

nature. Besides the grand views she also looks closer to subjects and paints what others may not see. Her use of color, texture and brushwork convey the beauty of the landscapes while she endeavors to show the immediacy of the moment. Mary strives to have a "Plein Air state of mind" when painting in her studio. It has allowed her to hone her artistic skills and focus on replicating the different senses of feeling, hearing, smell. This awareness has continued into her studio work bringing the outdoors alive in her work. Artistic influences in her life are always present when painting. The advice and lessons remain as part of her journey as an artist" (maryjabens.com).

Learning!

Plein air, adjective denoting or in the manner of the 19th-century style of painting outdoors.

As we learned from other plein air painting sessions, the weather, noise, directions to the venue, and other elements impact the plein air experience. Hence the warning on the advertisement: "This is a working farm with all the sights, sounds, smells (and maybe flies) of a working farmyard. There are no restrooms. Consider a hat, jacket, water, sunscreen, insect repellent, etc."

Mona reported that some potential participants did not come because the program could not promise shade or a restroom.

That's okay! The "Third Thursday" program was developed to accommodate differing styles and experiences.

Public Art

Parowan has several pieces of public art – art that is open and available to the public (sculptures, murals, statuary, and the like). Mayor Mollie Halterman, Tricia Harris, and Steve Decker serve on the Iron County Public Art Commission. Maria Twitchell, Executive Director, Cedar City-Brian Head Tourism Bureau, saw the need to organize a commission charged with identifying, maintaining, and creating art in Iron County. 
